
"The longstanding war of words between Washington and Tehran is edging toward something more dangerous...with Americans and Iranians jousting on the chaotic battleground of Iraq, the chances of a small incident spiraling into a crisis are higher than they've been in years," *Newsweek* reported. Nearly two decades later, the U.S. and Iran are engaging in another tit-for-tat proxy exchange—this time the battleground extends to the broader region and the Red Sea.
